



## Ray and Ginny's story

- 1** Ray and Ginny were missionaries working in Ecuador. They worked with the Quichua [keet-CHEW-ah] people living in villages in the Andes Mountains.
- 2** Along with leading Bible studies and sharing Jesus with people who had never heard the Gospel, Ray and Ginny also helped the Quichua with their animals.
- 3** Ray's common work outfit included leather chaps and syringes of medicine. Villagers often lined up to have their livestock tagged and inspected. Another unusual way Ray and Ginny helped the Quichua was with guinea pigs.
- 4** Guinea Pigs are a delicacy in Ecuador. So Ray and Ginny began to teach the Quichua to raise them to help their families earn money. They also used the animals to explain practical Bible truths. In this photo, Ray is sharing that guinea pigs need light just like we need Jesus – the Light of the World.
- 5** Because of our giving to international missions, Ginny and Ray were able to witness to the Quichua people, like these women. In Ecuador, \$150 can provide a tank of gas for a month. Ray and Ginny used the gas in their truck to get to the villages.
- 6** Ray and Ginny are now working in another part of South America because the Quichua believers have begun to start and lead their own churches. God can do amazing things with our offerings!
