Here are some questions and discussion starters based on the video you have seen. As time allows, discuss the following:

1. Why did Jamie and her family decide to make a set of Bible story pictures?

Jamie and her family know that many people in the world cannot read the Bible, and many people do not even have a Bible. Hearing Bible stories told while looking at pictures is a popular way for these people to learn about God.

2. Why did Jamie and her family decide to put the pictures on the backs of playing cards?

People in China and Taiwan love to play cards. This is where the Lim family got the idea of making sets of cards with Bible stories on them. The family hopes the cards will also be taken across borders into restricted-access countries where it may not be easy to transport Bibles.

3. Does Jamie think of herself as an artist?

Jamie loves art; it relaxes her. She thinks her sister and her friend are better artists, and at times she felt frustrated when she compared her own artwork to theirs. But she believed that God could use her talents anyway, so she continued with the project.

4. What is a UPG?

A UPG is an “unreached people group.” An unreached people group is defined as a group of people that has a Christian population of less than 2 percent. China has many small minority groups that are UPGs.

5. What is a UUPG?

A UUPG is an “unengaged unreached people group.” This means that the Christian population is less than 2 percent and there is no one working among those people to tell them about Jesus.

6. How many UUPGs are in East Asia?

East Asia has many UPGs, but only 259 of them are considered UUPGs, and this is because no one is there to tell the people about Jesus.
