Your children have had the opportunity to learn about the art of henna, a temporary and elaborate design drawn on the skin. Pakistan is just one country where drawing henna is a tradition. A temporary dye is made with plants and is worn for weddings and various occasions representing luck, joy and beauty. It is believed that wearing henna is a way to gain blessing. Christian workers know that the true blessing is knowing Jesus and they are using henna to share Him with others!
